- 1817 The first Women's Institute was formed by Adelaide Hoodless of Stoney Creek, Ontario.
- 1909 · First Women's Institute in Alberta.
- 1927 Scholarships were instituted at Provincial Schools of Agriculture which are still awarded each year.
- 1959. 50th Anniversary celebrated.
 Family Allowance payment for school children over 16 years of age, Indian voting rights, mandatory degree course for social workers.
- 1985 Helped establish Alberta Advisory Council on Women's Issues.
- 1986 Itelped establish the Alberta Farm Women's Network.
- 1992 · Annual convention in June at Olds, Alberta.
